Basic Disaster Supplies Kit

To assemble your kit, store items in airtight plastic bags and put your entire disaster supplies kit in one or two easy-to-carry containers such as plastic bins or a duffel bag.



A basic emergency supply kit could include the following recommended items:

	Water https://www.ready.gov/water - one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
\bigcirc	Food https://www.ready.gov/food - at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
\bigcirc	Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert
\bigcirc	Flashlight
\bigcirc	First aid kit

\bigcirc	Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
