	Take a deep dive with your extra-curricular activities. See what leadership roles you can take on and ways you can make an impact in those organizations
	Start applying for outside scholarships
	Start working on your college applications and essays during the summer
12	TH GRADE:
	Enroll in tough courses you feel confident you can also do well in (sign up for AP Classes or a dual credit course if available)
	Have your parents or a college counselor review your application
	Finalize your college applications and submit them
	Finish all standardized tests and send test scores as required
	Attend college fairs
	Apply for scholarships
	Fill out financial aid profiles and apply for scholarships
	Make final campus visits
	Hear back from colleges and decide which one you want to attend
