- ☐ Pet Industry Joint Advisory Council of Canada - Find resources, online courses, events and tradeshow information to help you with your pet care business
- ☐ Canadian Veterinary Medical Association - Find information and advice from veterinary professionals on common health issues for the pets in your care.

## Setting up your mobile pet care business

- ☐ Protecting your business - Your company is your greatest investment. Discover safeguard options that will help keep your business secure.
- ☐ Pricing - Know the factors that will help you determine the payment you will receive in exchange for your goods or services

- ☐ Stock control and inventory Explore various stock control techniques and learn how to develop a suitable inventory system
