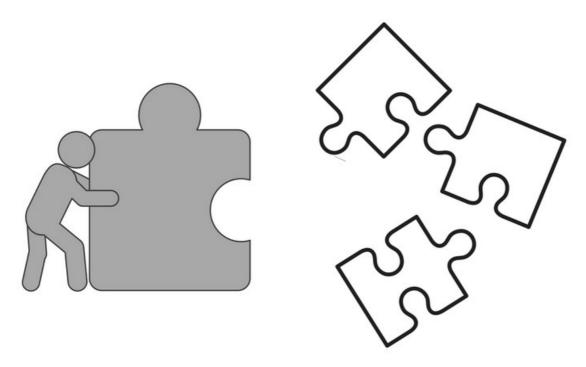
How to Choose a Business Partner
