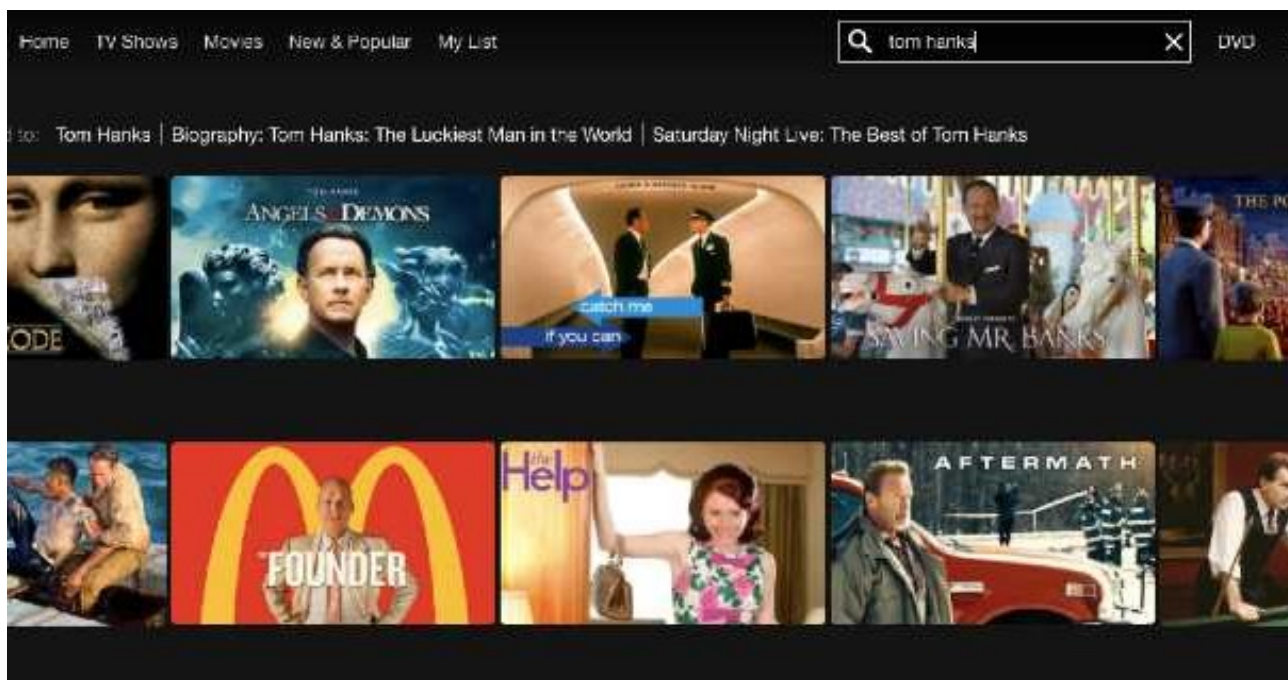


The Complete List of Every Tom Hanks Movie

Cast Away (2000)

Road to Perdition (2002)

Larry Crowne (2011)

Extremely Loud & Incredibly Close (2011)
