This is a general checklist that is very similar to the one a student teacher would receive from their college professor.



- **Areas of Observation by Cooperating Teacher (Classroom Teacher)**

- 1. Is the student teacher prepared?
- 2. Do they have knowledge of the subject matter and a purpose?
- 3. Can the student teacher control students' behavior?
- 4. Does the student teacher stay on topic?
- 5. Is the student teacher enthusiastic about the lesson they are teaching?
- 6. Does the student teacher have the ability to

- 8. Do students actively participate in class activities and discussions?
- 9. How do the students respond to the student teacher?
- 10. Does the teacher communicate effectively?

- **Areas of Observation by College Supervisor**

- 1. General appearance and demeanor
- 2. Preparation
- 3. Attitude towards the classroom
- 4. Effectiveness of lessons
- 5. Presenter effectiveness
- 6. Classroom management and behavior

- **Areas of Observation Used in Self-Evaluation**

- 1. Are my objectives clear?
- 2. Did I teach my objective?
- 3. Is my lesson timed well?
- 4. Do I remain on one topic too long or too short?
- 5. Do I use a clear voice?
- 6. Was I organized?
- 7. Is my handwriting legible?
- 8. Do I use proper speech?
- 9. Do I move around the classroom enough?
- 10. Did I use a variety of teaching materials?
- 11. Do I show enthusiasm?
- 12. Do I have make good eye-contact with the students?
- 13. Did I explain the lesson effectively?
- 14. Were my directions clear?
- 15. Did I show confidence and knowledge of the subject?
